

Adult Services Updates

Happy fall Friends! As we look forward to the chilly nights I wanted to reflect on the amazing summer we had at the library. This summer's programming schedule for adults was packed full of some amazing presenters and performers thanks to Friends of the Whitefish Bay Public Library!

We hosted two fantastic speakers as part of our monthly Whitefish Bay TALKS. In June, Andi Cloud presented *Ho-Chunk: People of the Sacred Language*. Andi is a member of the Ho-Chunk Nation and she gave us an overview of the Ho-Chunk tribe, looking at their past, describing their present as well as what the future holds. She also sprinkled in some lessons for life. I had read about Andi in the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel* back in 2021 as she was the first Native American storyteller-in-residence at the Madison Public Library. It was such a treat to hear Andi's stories, and her visit would not have been possible without the support of Friends!

Then in July, we welcomed Dr. Jean Creighton, astronomer and Director of the UWM's Manfred Olson Planetarium. Dr. Creighton took us to the stars to discuss the James Webb Telescope and the search for planets outside of our solar system. Dr. Creighton was very knowledgeable about her topic and really wowed the audience of adults and young people with her out of this world presentation.

One of my favorite things to book is music and I'm so happy we got to finish the summer with a live band. We danced and jammed out to a performance by the group CNJ Latin Jazz. Founded in 2012, this all-star lineup of musicians brought to life their unique approach to many traditional Latin jazz classics, American jazz standards and contemporary music. It was a lively performance and again would not have been possible without support of Friends of the Whitefish Bay Public Library. I hope to see you soon at the library!

Our community is very generous in donating books and media to the Friends. This is a unique story!

A storage locker manager asked us if we could take boxes of CDs from a locker that had been abandoned. There are hundreds of CDs and not just the plain vanilla variety:

They are in several languages (English, Spanish, French, etc.).

They are an eclectic collection including for example, Indonesian Funk and Australian Garage Bands.

There are many reissues/remasters of 1960s originals and many obscure European and US bands, including bands that contain one band member who went on to make it big in a subsequent band.

There are many CD sets.

We've had fun researching these CDs and listing them on eBay. They've been a valuable source of income for the Friends - all to go to the projects and programs we sponsor at your library.

Youth Services Update

1095 kids and teens registered for our summer reading program, which brought us back up to pre-pandemic levels of registration. We brought back our paper logs, and I think that really helped our turn-out. After participants finished their first level, they receive a free book, which are generously provided by Friends of the Whitefish Bay Public Library. We were able to give out more than 600 books to kids and teens participating in the program this summer. It's a cornerstone of our program, and I'm so proud it's something we're able to do. Thank you, Friends, for making that possible.

We also used our Friends of the Whitefish Bay Public Library funding to offer some creative and exciting programming for all ages. I wanted to highlight one particular program, because it was such a success and we also used our Friends funding in a very unique way.

At the beginning of August, we had approximately 75 toddlers and preschoolers and their caregivers attend our sensory car wash program. We had toy cars, oobleck "mud" for dunking (made out of cocoa, cornstarch and water), and plenty of water, soap, and scrubbing tools to clean up the toys. I saw this idea on a blog, but it was only meant for one or two children. The challenge was how to scale it up to a program that could work for 50+ kids.

Part of our Friends funding goes to those weird little youth services items that might not make sense on first glance, but add up to a wonderful program. Things like plastic kiddie pools, cocoa and cornstarch for oobleck, and a shopping spree at Dollar Tree for sponges, scrub brushes, toothbrushes and more. With these items and lots of staff creativity, we were able to make this program a success!

Position:

Volunteer Chair

General Description:

Recruit, and when necessary, train volunteers to help with the various Friends' activities.

Responsibilities:

- Recruit a sufficient number of volunteers, from an already well-developed list, to assist in the following activities:
- Twice yearly book sales
- Annual Green Day in the Bay community program
- Other activities as needed (i.e. special programs, receptions, etc.)
- Together with Membership Chair, monitor new member and renewal applications forms and follow-up with members who have expressed an interest in potential volunteer assignments
- Purchase and distribute yearly tokens of appreciation to volunteers in recognition of National Volunteer Week in October, in consultation with the Board
- Pleasant manner, patience, problem-solving ability, dependability and creativity.

Qualifications:

- Organizational, writing and speaking skills
- Interest in and knowledge of the WFB Public Library and Friends of the WFB Public Library
- Willingness to learn how to use our online sign-up program. We currently use Sign-up.com (Training provided)
- Comfort with email and basic computer functions.

Time Commitment:

Attendance and participation in all monthly Board meetings during the year. Board meetings last approximately one hour. Participation in various projects and activities as your talents and interests are appropriate. Time commitment will vary.
